The Buffalo Olmsted Parks Conservancy will unveil upcoming work and design plans for the Jesse Kregal Pathway improvement project in Delaware Park. The \$1.2 million pathway, lighting and signage project is located behind the Buffalo and Erie County Historical Society Museum and funded through NYPA for the Niagara River Greenways. The Buffalo Olmsted Parks Conservancy is a not-for-profit, independent, community organization that promotes, preserves, restores, enhances, and ensures maintenance of Frederick Law Olmsted-designed parks and parkways in the Greater Buffalo area now and for future generations. In 2008, the Conservancy released its Plan for the 21st Century, a blueprint for the management and restoration of the entire park system. Listed on the National and State Register of Historic Places, the Olmsted system in Buffalo is the first of its kind in the nation designed by America's greatest landscape architect.
